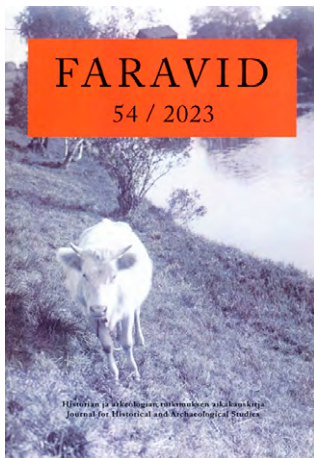

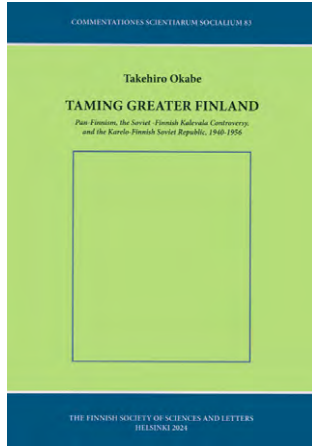

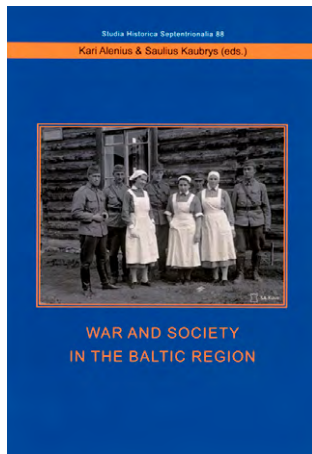

The Soviet Union “tamed” Greater Finland by picking up useful elements – in particular the pan-Finism ideology and hierarchy – from it to justify its rule in the Soviet-Finnish borderlands.
